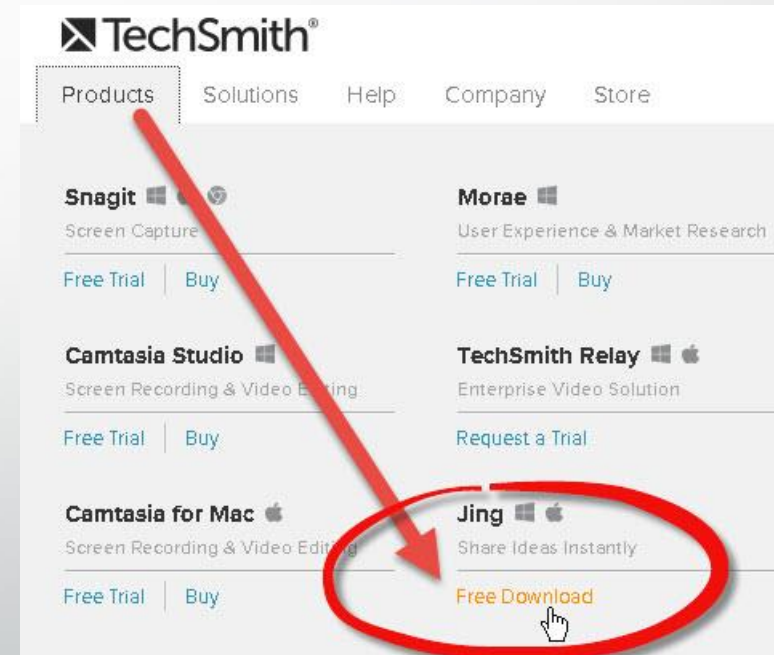


# How do you get **Jing**?

## Free but, Download required

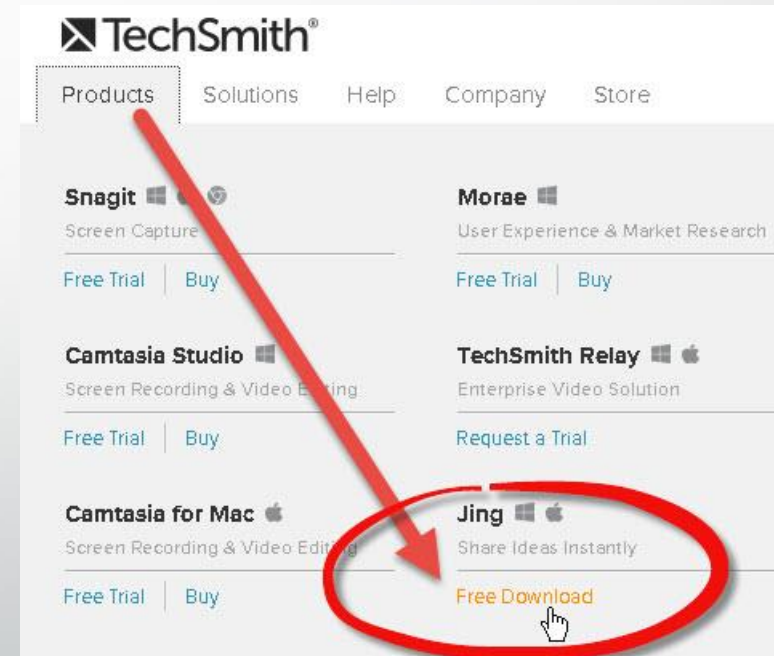
- **At home:** Go to [Techsmith.com](https://www.techsmith.com), move over "Products", click on "Download Jing"
- **At work:** Try out in [Tech Center 952](#); and/or ask IT to install
- Create an id using your [email address](#)



# What's free and easy?

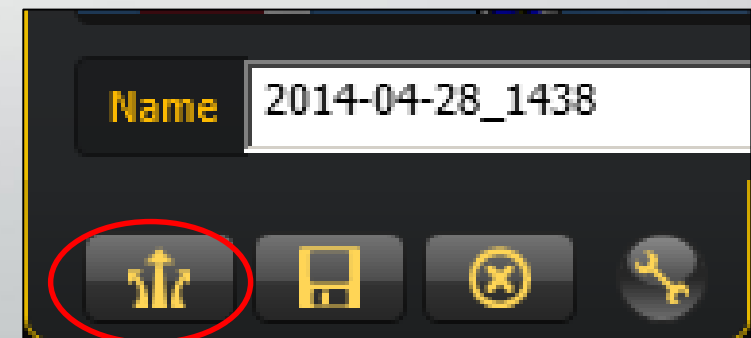
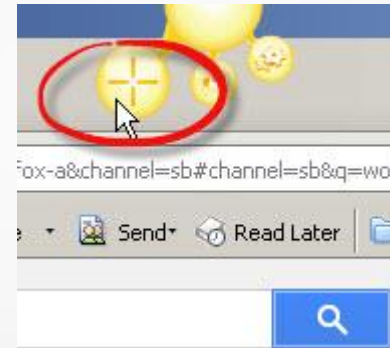
## Jing video

- Quickly create a **short** video, such as a tour of your class: **5 minutes or less**
- Whatever you do on the computer screen, and say, will be **recorded** on your video
- Send your videos all over the web



# Four steps to create a Jing video

1. Click on Start-All Programs-  
Techsmith-Jing
2. On Jing "Sun", click "Capture". Drag your cursor around the target area; click on "Capture Video"
3. After a 3 second countdown, you're being recorded! Click **Pause** for a break, then Click **Record**. Click **Stop**.
4. Click **Preview**. If ok, click on **Save to screencast.com**.



# Add video to Sakai as a link and/or display videos in Lessons

- 1) Use the Text Editor (such as in Lessons); click on Add Text, paste your screencast.com web address
- Select your web address and click on the link tool; paste your address again, click OK. **OR**
- 2) Paste the link in Lessons-Add Multimedia, Click Save.
- Tip: Upload your script file to resources and use Add Text to add a link to your script
