
How to Set Up Forum Topics in Sakai

Before using the Forums tool for online discussions, the instructor must add the Forums tool to the site AND create one or more topics.

Step 1: Add a Forum to your Sakai site

- 1. To add the Forums tool to your course site:
 - Go to Site Info > Manage Tools, select the Forums tool, click Continue, then Finish
- 2. On the course menu, click the Forums button.
- 3. In the Forums area, you will see that Sakai has created an initial course forum based on your course name. Underneath this forum is a TOPIC called **General Discussion**.



The General Discussion topic can be a place for students to ask general questions about the course or engage in discussion not related to specific course content.

• TIP: As instructor, you'll need to monitor the General Discussion topic at least weekly to answer students' questions. If you don't want to use (and monitor!) the General Discussion topic, you should delete it. To do that, to the right of the General Discussion topic, click More, then Delete Topic.

Step 2: Add Topics to the Forum

Under the course forum, the instructor should add a new TOPIC for each week of the course (or for each topic the class will discuss). To do this, to the right of the course forum title, click **New Topic**.



NOTE: Be sure to add new Topics, NOT new forums. Posting can happen only in Topics. If you don't add Topics, no one will be able to post.


These are the recommended Topic settings:

1. Topic Title (required) - Example: Week 1 Topic

2. Short Description


The short description is limited to 255 characters, which is not enough space for posting a question and instructions for students. Therefore we recommend putting your question in the larger (full) **Description** box (see step 3 below).

In order for students to see the text that you enter in the (full) Description, they will have to click on a link that says "View Full Description". This is not always obvious to students. To help them out, in the **Short Description** box, enter a note like this:



3. (Full) Description

The (full) description can be very long and the text can be formatted. This is a good location for your topic questions and instructions; it replaces the need to create an instructor post.



4. Topic Posting

☐ **Lock Topic** (*NOT* recommended)

Locks the topic so students can no longer post, but they can continue to read existing posts. Be sure to leave this unchecked initially. Later you can enable it, AFTER the due date has passed, if you want to allow students to read but *not submit* posts after the due date.

☐ Moderate Topic (NOT recommended)

All posts must be approved by a moderator (the instructor) before students can see them.

Require user to post before reading (*recommended*)

Students must post to the topic first before they can see any other posts. This encourages originality and prevents students from restating what others have already posted.

TIP: If you enable this option, be sure to put the question and instructions in the Description box and NOT in a forum post, which students will not be able to see until after they post...


□ Posts are anonymous (*NOT* recommended)

If you choose this, you will be unable to tell who posted what!

- 5. Availability Either option is acceptable:
 - ☐ Show immediately (topic will be visible to students now) OR -
 - ☐ Specify dates to **open** (show) and/or **close** (hide) the topic from students

To specify dates:

- a. Click in the **Open** and/or **Close date field** or on the **calendar icon**
- b. Select month and year
- c. Select the day of the month
- d. Drag the sliders for the hour and minute
 (Do NOT select 12:00 am; it is confusing to students.)
- e. Click Done to save



6. Grading

To send topic grades to Sakai's Gradebook, first you must go into the Gradebook and add a Gradebook item for the topic. Then, you will be able to select the appropriate Gradebook item from the drop down list here.



TIP: Grading is covered fully in a separate handout and video on How to Grade Discussion Posts.

- 7. **Permissions** We recommend that instructors not make changes to Permissions.
- 8. Click Save. Your new topic will be created. (To make changes after saving, click Topic Settings).
